THE BEST OF OUR GROUNDS AND GARDENS

A cursory look at our grounds will reveal pristine flowerbeds, easy walking routes and a gently trickling stream. But look a little closer and you'll find some hidden treasures – we asked our team to pick three of the best for you:



War memorial

Dedicated to six brave bomb disposal engineers who sadly lost their lives in 1940. An enemy bomber jettisoned his load over Nantwich, and after successfully defusing two of the bombs with just pliers and screwdrivers the third exploded prematurely. Lest we forget.

Secret garden and wildlife meadow

Our gardens are home to many a hidden treasure but if we had to pick one, we'd pick our secret garden. It's so peaceful you'd never believe a bustling hotel was just metres away, perfect for a quiet day spent watching the world go by.



TOWNS AND CITIES

With Nantwich on our doorstep, and Chester not far away, there are plenty of places of historical interest, architectural beauty, and of course some excellent retail therapy to choose from.

Nantwich is famous for its high concentration of Tudor and Georgian architecture (as well as hosting the annual International Cheese Awards), and also boasts a plethora of jewellery boutiques, antique dealerships and craft stores.

Queens Park

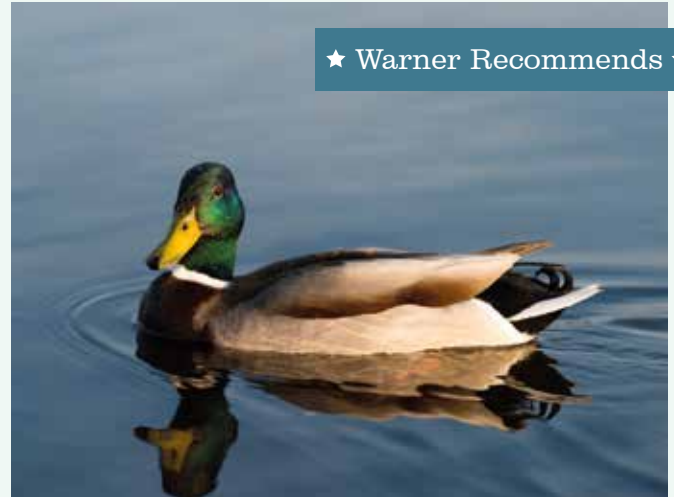

LOCAL FLAVOUR

We asked our team to recommend some of Cheshire's hidden gems and they didn't disappoint. Below you'll find antiques, animals, a boat lift, and some of the tastiest ice cream around.

Anderton Boat Lift

One of only two working boat lifts in the UK (and a lot closer to Alvaston than Falkirk), the Cathedral of the Canals won 'experience of the year' in 2019, with its accompanying visitors centre and coffee shop situated right next to the Anderton Nature Park.

VIEWRANGER AT ALVASTON HALL

What is ViewRanger?

ViewRanger is one of the world's leading digital exploring guides, available for all Apple and Android devices, that lets you explore local areas on foot or by bike like never before. We've joined forces to provide a few routes around our hotels and villages for all levels of fitness. With ViewRanger you can follow the map with or without a data connection, with viewpoints, interesting attractions and helpful advice along the way.

How do I download ViewRanger?

It couldn't be simpler!

- 1 Go to your phone or tablet's app store
- 2 Search for "**ViewRanger**" and download "**ViewRanger - Hiking Trails & Bike Rides**" by Augmentra
- 3 Use the below web address or scan the QR code and it'll open up with our selection of routes for **Alvaston Hall** (it's up to you whether to create an account, although we do recommend it).

How do I get going?

Simply tap the signpost button in the top left corner of the app and select your chosen route. You can do this from the starting point or back at the hotel, and you can even download the route so there's no need to use up your data allowance while you're wandering.



All of the routes are self-guided so that you can do them at a time and pace that suits you. Here are a few tips to help you enjoy your adventure:

- Check the weather and be prepared with wet weather gear, or a coat, hat and maybe sunscreen when necessary
- Wear sensible shoes or walking boots, most of our routes are on well-worn paths, tracks, trails or woodland and pastoral land. There might be some muddy areas, gates or stiles to cross
- Pack a bottle of water, not all routes have a café or pub en-route
- Capture the beautiful countryside with your camera
- Take your mobile phone just in case of emergency
